TERMINOLOGIES

Conceptual literature review (Chapter 3) is a search, survey, analysis, critique or compendium of concepts and theories related to the topic on hand. In this book, the concepts are the parenting styles and social behaviors.

Cogent summary (Chapter 4) in this book illustrates a logical and revealing epitome or review of the highlights about parenting aspects, parenting styles and social behaviors.

Empirical literature review (Chapter 3) consists of related studies made earlier. In this book, the past related studies refer to the parenting styles and social behaviors.

Immortal legacy (Chapter 5) means what the child now is, lives and survives forever as a legend.

Implications to parents and teachers (Chapter 5) are suggestions pertaining to how the child be handled at home by the parents and in the school by the teachers.

Parenting Styles (Chapter 3) refer to the manner in which parents show their belief about how to be a good or a bad parent. These beliefs influence how a parent interacts with his children, what he feels his role as a parent ought to be and what he should expect from his children. The parenting styles are determined in terms of the following aspects:

- 1. *parental attitude* which describes the parent as accepting, demanding, submissive or neglecting.
- 2. *parental control* where house rules and regulations are handled by the parent through discussing, issuing and expecting them to be obeyed, requiring few rules or setting no rules at all.
- 3. *parental communication* in any of these manners: warmly through eye or body contact; strictly through hands on hops, sighing, pointing finger or shaking head; carefully through reason and manipulation or indifferently through objections and accusations.
- 4. *Importance of child's needs* which refers to whether these needs are equally important than the parent's needs; less important than the parent's needs; more important than the parent's needs or never important than the parent's needs.
- 5. *Home atmosphere* which refers to the condition in the home whether created by the parent as relaxed, tensed, uncontrollable or negativistic.
- 6. *Discipline tools* which refer to the parent's enforcement of discipline through any of these: negotiation and incentive; yelling and punishment; giving up or no guidance.

Personal Assertions/Social Behaviors (Chapter 3) refer to the child's responses to some situations or interactions with people, which can either, be positive or negative. These depict ways which may be socially acceptable, appropriate or not (assertive, aggressive or passive).

1. Assertive behavior of a child in this book is described as confident, energetic and stands up for his rights in such a way that the rights of the other person are not violated.

2. Aggressive behavior is manifested by the child through hostility and standing up for his rights in such a way that the rights of the other person are violated and his intent is to dominate or humiliate.

3. Passive behavior of a child allows his rights to be violated by someone else. The child is apologetic, emotionally dishonest, indirect, self-denying and inhibited.

Primum Homo Esto (Let Him First Be A Man) means developing a child to be a righteous and responsible member of society through good parenting (Chapter 1).

Social realities surrounding the child (Chapter 1) distressing or not occurring within the multiple levels of environments that the child encounter directly and indirectly that influence his growth and development.
