KAMPALA. Former champions Kampala University (KU) could become the major casualties of the Pepsi University Football League group of death involving Uganda Christian University (KU) and Makerere University Business School (MUBS) as action in Group D resumed this afternoon. The two-time champions are looking to keep their hopes of joining the knockout stage of the competition alive when they travel away to International University of East Africa (IUEA). With only three points from four games, only a win can keep alive their hopes of leapfrogging UCU

who are at home against already qualified MUBS. "Thursday is going to be our most important game. It is what determines our season," said KU coach Tumusiime Vincent. "We not only need to win our game but also hope that the game goes our way in Mukono," he added. UCU are currently five points ahead of KU and a win will guarantee them a direct passage alongside today's opponents.

"I think we have done well so far. We struggled in the first two games but are now in a fairly good position. We need three points against MUBS and I am sure we shall get them and secure our progress," UCU coach Jimmy Mwera noted.

MUBS have already qualified for the knockout stage having accumulated 10 points but coach Ayiekoh Charles insists they will still give it their all against UCU.

"Our objective is to finish on top of the table and so we need to win against UCU," Ayiekoh said.
