

Mak guild president still missing

KAMPALA. The whereabouts of Makerere University's Guild president, Mr Julius Kateregga, were by press time last evening, still unknown with the police denying holding him in their detention centres.

Mr Kateregga, who has been at the forefront of fighting the 15 per cent fees increment, had in the morning of Wednesday, been scheduled to hold a crisis meeting with fellow students at Freedom Square at the university but did not show up.

He had earlier appeared on *NBS morning Breeze* show where he had discussed the ongoing fees policy impasse.

His vice, Ms Judith Nalukwago, claimed Mr Kateregga was arrested and taken to an unknown place. But Kampala Metropolitan police spokesperson Patrick Onyango denied the Force was holding Mr Kateregga in any of their detention cells.

"We do not know where Kateregga is. We did not arrest him and we cannot tell where he is right now," Mr Onyango said.

By last evening, at least 15 of the other students were still detained at Wandegaya Police Station.
